

## German Tech Entrepreneurship Center (GTEC) is expanding to Frankfurt

It is planned that the building will be a home to innovative and international startups, as well as to the innovation departments of several corporations created to further develop their ideas with support of the GTEC network of mentors and investors. Financed by the GTEC Partners, startups that take part in the GTEC programmes get all the benefits for free.

"We are very happy to now be able to expand our unique offering outside of Berlin, as I am sure that GTEC will enrich the Frankfurt scene.
